Alumni of IIT-Madras have launched a Leadership Series Program to act as mentors for engineering college in Tamilnadu. The focus is to enhance the quality of engineering education and making students graduating from these institutions, industry ready. The inauguration function for the current year PALS program was held in IIT Madras on 30th July, 2016. The PALS introduction speech was delivered by Mr.Srinivasan, Chairman, PALS.

Following the introduction speech, the PALS insignia was presented to partner institutes by Dr.Bhaskar, Director, IIT Madras. Keynote speeches were delivered by Dr.G.Viswanathan, Chancellor, VIT University on “Recalibration of Engineering Education for the future” and by M.M.Murugappan, Vice Chairman, Murugappa Groups on “Industry Academia Collaboration for Better Engineers”. The keynote speeches were followed by an interactive Q&A session with PALS members and the panelists.
